

### Good evening and welcome to tonight's re-arranged Evo-stik League Division One North fixture as we entertain Farsley FC.

On the plus side it was good to see last season's 'supporters player of the year' Lee Rick back in a Mossley shirt after he was re-signed after a spell with Droylsden. Lee's return is both timely and effective as he played a big part in Mossley's improved performance on Saturday. The club really needs the people of the town to get behind the lads and cheer them to success. Attendances have gradually improved over the course and we truly wish that you supporters play your part by spreading the word and help-

ing to get more people through the turnstiles.

Finances at the club are of course tight in the current climate and we have not been

helped by our failure to win FA Cup or FA Trophy games for a second successive season where the sponsorship money can be so lucrative. So, it is of extra importance that more funds are raised to continue our progress both on and off the pitch.

It's not all doom and gloom though, as despite our recent poor League results we have managed to reach the final of the Manchester FA Pre-


After a tough start in the last the game against Trafford we stayed composed and came away with a massive win.

The village of Farsley is mentioned in the Domesday book and is sandwiched between Leeds and Bradford. During the Industrial Revolution it was a centre for wool processing and is the birthplace of the Revd Samuel Marsden.

Farsley Celtic, as the club once became known, was founded by a group of local men in 1908. Farsley initially competed in the Leeds Amateur League. After the Second World War ended the club purchased its current ground at Throstle Nest from the local council, where it played its first match in 1948 against West Yorkshire side Frickley Athletic.

The Villagers moved up a level for the 1949-50 season, into the Yorkshire League Division Two where they finished eighth during their first season and scored 100 goals in 34 games, however they also conceded heavily. By 1951-52 Farsley Celtic were Yorkshire League Division Two champions and were promoted to the Yorkshire League Division One.By the mid-1950s, Farsley Celtic as they were later to call themselves, had established themselves as a mid table team in the Yorkshire league. They had a notable run in the FA Cup during the 1954-55 season where they reached the Fourth Qualifying Round, going out to Wigan Athletic 3-1. After finishing runners-up twice in succes-

sion, Farsley were champions of the Yorkshire League in 1959-60. However the club were not promoted due to not meeting up to the required ground regulations.. In 1968-69, and for the second time in its history, the Celts were crowned champions of the league but again were not promoted to a higher level. They came runners-up twice in the early 70s proving to be among the best in the league.

In the FA Cup, Farsley Celtic reached the First Round proper for the first time in 1974, playing Football League Division Three side Tranmere Rovers at Elland Road before a crowd of 11,000. The game ended 2-0 to Tranmere with Steve Coppell scoring the first of Tranmere's goals.

In 1982 the Yorkshire and Midland Leagues merged to form the Northern Counties East League. Farsley started in Division One North and for the first two seasons they finished third. In 1984-85 they won the Division One North championship and were promoted to the Northern Counties East Premier Division. It didn't take the club long to rise up the league and after only two seasons in the NCEL Premier Division, the Celts finished runners-up to Alfreton Town and were invited into the Northern Premier League as founder members of the Northern Premier League First Division. The first few seasons in the new surroundings often saw the club near the bottom end of the table. This pattern continued until the mid to late 1990s when they finished in the top six for three seasons in a row.

Farsley finished third in the 2003-04 season and earned promotion to the Northern Premier (Unibond) League Premier Division. In its first season the club finished third losing controversially a play off final with Workington on penalties. Farsley had, in fact, won the league after the expunding of the results of Spennymoor Town who had gone out of business during the season. Upon appeal by other clubs the FA overturned the league's decision and instead awarded three points to all teams with whom Spennymoor were unable to complete fixtures leaving Farsley in only a playoff place. The following season in May 2006 after a fourth place finish, promotion to the Conference North was secured after defeating North Ferriby United 2-1 after extra time in the play off final.



Farsley reached the First Round of the FA Cup for only the second time in its history during the 2006-07 season. After beating Cambridge City 2-1 in the Fourth Qualifying Round, the club was drawn against Milton Keynes Dons and held them to a 0-0 draw at

Throstle Nest before losing 2-0 in the replay at the National Hockey Stadium. In the Conference North, the club also performed well and reached the play-off final after finishing fifth, sneaking into the final play off place in the last match of the season A memorable match saw the club play Hinckley United at the Pirelli Stadium, the home of Burton Albion, winning 4-3 with a last minute penalty from Simeon Bambrook after

twice coming from behind, securing their place in the highest echelons of non league soccer for the fist time in their history during their centenary season.

Farsley performed admirably in its season in the Blue Square Premiership, with notable victories away at Torquay United and Histon. The then manager Lee Sinnott was appointed manager at Port Vale with his assistant John Deacey managing the club for the remainder of the season. Unfortunately he was unable to prevent the club from relegation although this was confirmed only in the last week of the season. Financial difficulties culminated in Farsley Celtic being placed in Administration in June 2009. The Football Conference's decision to prohibit them from playing their fixtures as a result of a breach to the infamous Appendix E



was quickly overturned, and the team began the season with a points deficit of -10. Manager Neil Parsley orchestrated an excellent start to the season, quickly cancelling the points deduction. A consortium led by club President John Palmer failed to purchase the club despite lenghty negociations with Administrators Mazars who prematurely called time on the team's season resultin eventually in the failure of the first team to complete its season and have its

results expunged.

Farsley AFC, reformed by Palmer's consortium were accepted by the Koolsport Northern Counties East League, Premier division in June 2010 thus allowing the continuation of 102 years of football to continue in the village. In the new club's inaugural season, the club secured the Premier Division Championship and League Cup.

Promoted to the Evo-stik League Division One North they finished in in 4th place but lost to eventual winners Witton Albion in the promotion play off semi final.

### Mossley made a spectacular return to form with a dramatic second half comeback to leapfrog opponents Trafford in the race for the play-offs.

Trailing by two goals at the break Mossley found their recently absent goalscoring touch to hit three great goals without response in a one sided second period.

The newly re-signed Lee Rick made his return debut in central midfield while Chris Denham and Chris Brown were both recalled to the starting line up to great effect.

With the wind in their favour Trafford were quickly out of the blocks and they won an early fruitless corner before Mossley got into gear. The Lilywhites playing some neat and well controlled football which saw Danny Broadbent and Lee Rick both go close, before the best move of the half finished with Adam Mather firing disappointingly wide from a good position.

Mossley's recent dip looked to be compounded as Trafford took the lead somewhat against the run of play in the 17th minute. The visitors won a corner on the right and Mossley keeper Russell Saunders misjudged the flight of Andy Smart's well taken in-swinger which looked destined for the net before former Mossley striker Michael Oates appeared at the far post to nod the ball home from just about on the goal line.

Worse was to come for Mossley as Trafford began to take control of the game when, on 24 minutes, left back Andy Smart placed a well struck shot just inside Saunders left hand post from outside the box to double Trafford's lead.

Having seemingly done the hard work Trafford then proverbially 'shot themselves in the foot' just two minutes later when one time Mossley midfielder Melford Knight needlessly lunged two footed into Chris Denham from behind and was immediately shown the red card by the perfectly positioned referee.

Nonplused by their reduction in numbers, Trafford continued to force the pace. They might have scored a third but skipper Nia Bayunu fired high over the bar from a great position. However, Trafford looked to be totally in control of the game as the sides went in at the break.

Whatever player-boss Steve Halford said to his players at half time most definitely worked, despite an injury enforced half time substitution that saw Sam Hind replace Danny Broadbent.

Within two minutes of the restart Mossley had a foot-hold back in the game. Hind flicked a header on to Sam Madeley, who's deft back heel into the path of Adam Mather saw the left midfielder fire home with a precise shot from the edge of the box. Game on!

Mossley continued to press as Trafford's defending became more desperate and the increasingly inevitable equaliser finally came on 61 minutes as Chris Denham hammered home from ten yards after Trafford keeper Read had palmed away Madeley's effort amid another scramble in the Trafford box.

Trafford won a corner quickly after the restart but Mossley defended well and broke quickly again putting Trafford on the back foot. With Mossley pressure continuing there looked only one outcome and that outcome duly came to pass in the 76th minute. Chris Brown fed a perfect ball from the right between centre half and full back finding Chris Denham with his back to goal. The clever forward spun quickly and hammered the ball past Read at his near post to send the recently suffering Mossley fans into jubilation.

Mossley looked far more likely to add a fourth than did Trafford to equalise in the remaining time, though there was a last minute fright when Saunders was forced to grasp the ball in a crowded area as Trafford swung in a final desperate corner kick.

The dramatic nature of the comeback and the resulting boost in confidence will hopefully now galvanize Mossley to put a winning run together in this increasingly vital stage of the season.

### Manchester FA PREMIER CUP 2012 / 13

The Manchester Premier Cup, then known as the Manchester County FA Shield, was first competed for in the 1934-35 season, when Manchester North End beat Hurst 5-2, in the final to become the inaugural champions at their Charles Street Ground in Blackley in front of crowd of 2,400. The gate receipts of £59 were distributed 50% to the FA and 25% to each of the finalists.

In 1955 it became known as the Manchester Intermediate Cup and in 1979 the Manchester Premier Cup. Mossley won the Shield in 1938 and 1949 and were runners up in 1937,

1939 and 1947.

Mossley won the old Intermediate Cup on three occasions, in 1961, 1967 and 1968 and were runners up on two occasions in 1959 and 1964.

The clubs that have won the Manchester Premier Cup the most times are:

Droylsden - 8

Ashton United, Hyde United - 6 Curzon Ashton - 5

Mossley - 3

Glossop North End - 2

Irlam Town, Maine Road,

Radcliffe Borough - 1

Mossley last won the Premier Cup on the pitch in 1991 when the Lilywhites beat Droylsden 3-2 at Manchester City's Maine Road Stadium.

Mossley have appeared in three finals since then, in 2000, 2009 and 2012 Mossley being pitched against Droylsden in all three.

In 2000 and 2009 Droylsden were the winners by identical 2-1 scorelines and both finals were played at Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park.

Last season, after wins over FC United of Manchester, Abbey Hey and Salford City, Mossley were controversially awarded the Trophy by default when Droylsden were unable to raise an eligible team for the Final which was scheduled for Hyde's Ewen Fields Stadium.

### With Farsley being a reformed club and today being only our fourth meeting we have few previous meetings to look back on.

Last season Mossley met Farsley FC for the first time and the re-formed club won both meetings 2-1 at Seel Park and 3-0 at Throstle Nest

However, we did meet Farsley's predecessors Farsley Celtic on six occasions in the 1990's. Four times in Division One of the UniBond Northern Premier League in seasons 1993/94 and 1994/95 and twice in cup ties

In 1993/94 the sides drew 2-2 at Seel Park with Mossley's goals scored by Simon Mooney and Colin Julian in Diviision One of the UniBond League.

The Mossley team was: Rod Bates, Dave Blow, Andy Noone, Simon Mooney, Micky Boyle, Colin Julian Darren McHugh, Dave Galloway, Dave Brown, Barry Diamond, Colin Heywood. Subs: Rob Price & Mark Hilditch

The return game at Farsley saw the home side win 2-1 with Phil Hulme scoring the Mossley goal.

Mossley and Farsley also met that season in the Uni-Bond League Division One Cup with Farsley winning 4-0 at the Throstle Nest

The 1994/95 season was a disaster for Mossley as the side was relegated to the North West Counties eague

Mossley had just appointed their third manager of the season when Mossley and Farsley Celtic met at Seel Park on Saturday 18th March 1995

Almost the entire team had departed in the wake of the controversial dismissal of

# Memory Lane

Manager Roy Soule by the even more controversial club Chairman at the time, Frank Whelan, following an unlucky 1-0 defeat at Radcliffe Borough the previous Saturday and a midweek trip to Caernarfon Town was then postponed at short notice as Mossley couldn't raise a team in time and later suffered a points deduction and fine for their failure to play the game. Certainly one of the most embarrassing moments in Mossley's then 92 vear history

Newly appointed Player Manger Paul Cuddy, formerly a star player at Altrincham and an England Semi Pro International

Cuddy had his work cut out assembling a new team in less than half a week. That he did so and then gained a 3-1 victory is to his great credit.

Only four players remained from Soule's team for the game - goalkeeper Rod Bates, central defenders Paul Uttley and Mark Walsh and striker Mark Aitken.

Aitken and Uttley were both goalscorers that day with young striker Lee Cunliffe, signed on the eve of the game from Chorley Reserves, scored the third and match clinching goal.

The eight players who made their Mossley debuts that day were full backs Neil McKay and Paul Hanvey, Danny Kent. Cuddy himself partnered fellow new boy Danny Kent in midfield with the untried Jason Glasgow on the right wing and full back Charlie Havnes on the left. Veterans Tony Aigbogin and Keith Johnson with a combined age of over 75 were the Mossley substitutes. The boot was firmly on the

other foot when the sides next met in the penultimate game of the season. It was a game Mossley needed to win to avoid relegation to the North West Counties League.

The experienced former Witton Albion and Radcliffe striker Tony Jarvis scored for Mossley but Farsley responded with three goals to win the match, and, despite Paul Cuddy's best efforts, condemn Mossley to relegation

Our sides also met once in the FA Cup - a 2nd Qualifying Round tie at the Throstle Nest in the 1996/97 season when Farsley won 3-1. Mossley's goal being a 25 yard screamer by veteran centre forward Bernie Hughes who was in his last season before retirement.

Kevan Keelan was Mossley's manager at that time.

Mossley deserved their lead when it came on 24 minutes as Hind hit a low cross shot from the right that foxed the home defence and new boy Adam Mather popped up at the far post to poach the opener from close range.

When Bob Murphy first took charge of Mossley in January 1974 his first target was a striker. He quickly signed centre forward Tommy Aspinall from Wigan Athletic and the team's fortunes quickly improved under Murphy's firm leadership.

However, two weeks into the 1974-75 season Murphy was contacted by former Lilywhites boss Don Wilson regarding a young striker who had been at Manchester City as a junior and who Wilson's current club Radcliffe Borough had signed from Glossop. Wilson stated that he consid-

ered 20 years old Moore to be too good for the Cheshire League and that Mossley could have him for a nominal £100 fee.

Murphy took Wilson's advice and promptly signed the talented forward. Moore made a scoring debut for Mossley bagging in 1-1 draw against Matlock Town in a League Cup tie.

Moore's first League goal came in a 2-2 draw against Altrincham at Seel Park on 7th September 1974.

Tommy Aspinall, Jimmy Riley, Bobby Manning and Bob Street were all tried as Moore's strike partner but the coup de grâce came in January 1975 when centre forward Leo Skeete arrived, initially on Ioan, from Rochdale.

The pair hit off an instant understanding. Moore missed only three games through to the end of the season and scored 38 goals, breaking the club's post war scoring record for the first time, playing off Skeete's flicks and lay-offs to great effect.

The partnership was to provide the strike force for Mossley's fantastic successes over the following eight years.

Moore hit 33 goals in 57 appearances in 1975-76, 32 in 55 games the following season and 29 in 43 games in 1977-78.

1978-79 saw Moore break the club's post war goalscoring record again, this time with 41 goals in Mossley's all conquering forward line which included Skeete, Ian Smith and Eamonn O'Keefe as the Lilywhites achieved the Northern Premier League title and League Cup double.

As Mossley retained the NPL title in the 1979-80 season Moore scored 26 goals in 41 games and took his place on the team-sheet when Mossley faced Dagenham at Wembley Stadium in the 1980 FA Trophy Final.



Mossley finished NPL runners up the following season with Moore scoring 20 in 42 games and in 1981-82, his last for the club, he scored 14 in 32 appearances.

Moore decided to retire from semi pro football in 1982 and played for a couple of years for The New Streetbridge Inn in the Gorton Sunday League where he continued to rack up the goals.

Brian Grundy replaced Murphy as manager in 1984 and tried to bring Moore back to Seel Park but he played only one game under Grundy scoring in a defeat by Buxton.

Moore played a total of 399 games for Mossley and scored a club record 234 goals.

A butcher by tried Moore left football for good in the mid 1980's.

Dave Moore was widely considered one of the best strikers never to play in the Football League and it amazing that no higher club than Mossley ever took a chance on him.
